Michael Mendelowitz is the General Counsel of the UK branch of ERGO Versicherung AG (part of the Munich Re Group). Qualified as a barrister in both South Africa and England and subsequently as an English solicitor, he was, prior to taking up his current role, a partner in two international law firms: Barlow Lyde & Gilbert (BLG) from 1990 to 2007 and Norton Rose Fulbright from 2007 to 2014.

Michael's insurance and reinsurance experience covers a wide spectrum of classes of business, including international casualty and property catastrophe, marine, aerospace, professional indemnity and products liability. While in private practice, he was highly regarded for managing disputes over contract interpretation or materiality of underwriting information, allocation and aggregation of losses, long tail liability issues (including asbestos-related and environmental claims) and insurer insolvency. He was also regularly involved in corporate and other non-contentious work, such as advising on contract wordings for complex or structured reinsurance and alternative risk transfer transactions.

Michael led the BLG team which, following the terrorist attacks in the USA on 11<sup>th</sup> September 2001, advised and represented the company that was appointed to underwrite and manage the UK government-backed scheme for insurance and reinsurance of aviation war and terrorism liability risks.

From 1990 to 2007, he was Assistant Secretary-General of AIDA and is now an honorary life member of the Association.
